


Wednesday Prayer Group

Remembrance Banner

The cross at the centre of the banner mirrors the simple crosses which mark the graves of the servicemen who gave and continue to give their lives in the cause of peace. The red poppies honour their ultimate sacrifice. The white poppies demonstrate our commitment to defending the peace we enjoy, that was and is, won at such a high cost both here and across the world. The words 'Lest we Forget' are taken from a poem written by Rudyard Kipling in which he warns of the dangers of not learning from history and is echoed by war poets ever since.

Fire Precautions
