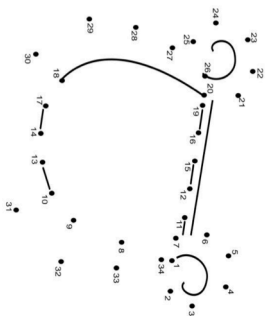
OPEN SPACE- Thy Kingdom Come - 31st May and 1st June
